UTS ePRESS, Gateways: International Journal of Community Research and Engagement

UTS ePRESS is the digital scholarly publishing arm of the University of Technology Sydney (UTS), publishing high quality and open scholarship reflecting the University's values of research excellence and public benefit. As part of this work, UTS ePRESS regularly reviews the performance of journal publications and reports on key performance indicators.

As one of our long-standing journals—but one that works outside the usual academic journal framework—*Gateways* continues to perform strongly against traditional bibliometric indicators (e.g. citation counts), and relevant social impact measures and ethical standards policies. It maintains significant growth in article downloads and strong evidence of engagement from scholars and communities.

The following figures demonstrate the genuine public demand for important and innovative community-centred research, which *Gateways* is in a strong position to meet.

Key performance outcomes include:

Impact

Journal impact has traditionally been based on citations. It is now acknowledged that citation measures are an incomplete picture of a journal's quality and total impact. This is especially relevant to a journal such as *Gateways* which works at the intersection of academia and community practice, and aims to have impact beyond scholarly citations. Nevertheless, *Gateways* performs well in this area, with evidence of growing citations to *Gateways*' articles in scholarly publications.



For a journal such as *Gateways*, reach is a significant indicator of the scholarly focus, timeliness and interest in the articles published by the journal. For an open publisher such as UTS ePRESS, reach is a strategic measure of the accessibility, engagement and locational interest in our published works. The following world map shows global distribution of *Gateways* journal readers, demonstrating *Gateways*' extraordinary growth. This has been driven in part by the decision to publish in both HTML and PDF formats, which has significantly increased accessibility and online discoverability.

Quality and Reputation

An important measure of the journal's quality and reputation lies in it being accepted for membership by the leading industry standards bodies, COPE, DOAJ and OASPA, which set strict guidelines around scholarly and open publishing in terms of quality (e.g. peer review) and ethics (e.g. editorial independence, governance and transparency). *Gateways* is a member of all three organisations. Other indicators of quality and reputation include the calibre of authors and board members.

It provides a forum for academics, practitioners and community representatives to explore issues and reflect on practices relating to the full range of engaged activity.
